



- Theme for HMD is One Day.
- Holocaust Memorial Day is One Day, when we all come together in our communities, to learn from the Holocaust and genocides - for a better future.
- Talk to the children about the holocaust (age appropriate) and why it is important to remember - so we don't forget the lives of the people that were lost and the beliefs that caused it to begin.
- Link to being honest about our past in order to learn from it.
- It reminds us that we need to come together and unite, rather than divide because of our differences.
- Watch HMD Video (it is from 2017 but so poignant and really highlights the need to remember).
- Pick out what people are doing that is wrong.
- Pick out bits of the video where people are demonstrating social courage: making the right choice/showing tolerance/acceptance of others and their beliefs, e.g. rainbow laces for football team.
- How did those people feel after someone helped them?
- How can you be the example of social courage?
