




<b>mouth (noun)</b>	Where a river ends / meets the sea or a lake	
<b>tributary (noun)</b>	A tributary is a stream or river that flows into a larger one.	
<b>Human feature</b>  <b>Physical feature</b>	Human features are things that are built by humans (such as bridges and roads.) Physical features are natural objects such as mountains and rivers.

If they are less they are called hills.</li> <li>• The Pennines are a mountain range in England - they stretch from the Peak District to the Scottish border. Their total length is about 250 mi(402 km) They're the source of the River Mersey.</li> <li>• The mouth of the River Mersey is the Irish Sea</li> <li>• The Nile is the longest river in the world. It is 6,650 km long. The mouth is the Mediterranean Sea.</li> </ul>
